• Akilah Bateman Band Scholarship (open to Meadowcreek HS graduating seniors only)

A one-time award of \$300 sponsored by the family and friends in memory of Akilah Bateman to a graduating senior of Meadowcreek High School who has demonstrated proficiency in music with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in the field of music.

- o Exhibit good character and leadership skills
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Submit a two-page essay describing interest in the teaching profession

• Area 2 Gwinnett County Council of PTA Scholarship *application forthcoming* (open to applicants who attend Area 2 School: Peachtree Ridge, Lanier, North Gwinnett, Paul Duke STEM, Collins Hill, Duluth, GSMST, Mountain View, Norcross)

A one-time award of \$750 solely funded through the local PTA council membership and council contributions. Area 2 is proud to present this scholarship to one deserving high school senior attending each of the Area 2 high schools listed above (a total of 8 scholarships awarded) and has successfully met or exceeded the State of Georgia graduation requirements, with plans to continue their education by attending an accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational/trade school, or pursue other post-graduate education/training.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must be a graduating senior of an Area 2 high school with a PTA/PTSA
- o The PTA must be in good standing (ie. Paid dues, approved bylaws on file
- o The applicant and at least 1 adult from their household must be a PTSA member
- o Applicant is planning to attend an accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational/trade school, or pursue other post-graduate education/training.
- Applicant has a satisfactory scholastic record acknowledge by an administrator, counselor, or teacher.

• Beauty P. Baldwin Scholarship (open to applicants district-wide)

Upsilon Alpha Omega, the Gwinnett Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., was chartered in Gwinnett County on January 29, 1994. One of the first challenges taken on by the chapter was to establish a scholarship for young women in Gwinnett County. The scholarship was named in honor of one of our chartering members, Mrs. Beauty P. Baldwin. Thus far, we have awarded numerous scholarships totaling thousands of dollars to college-bound high school seniors.

Upsilon Alpha Omega is offering a scholarship to high school seniors to further their educational opportunities. The scholarship focuses on marginalized or disadvantaged communities (male or female). • Brenden and Alex Elbaz Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

The Brenden and Alex Elbaz Memorial Scholarship was initially established through the Gwinnett County Public Schools Foundation and was exclusive to a Lanier High School Student where his mother Joy Crowe was a teacher.

In 2011 Brenden Elbaz, at the age of 23, tragically died of a drug overdose. Nine years later, in 2020, Alex Elbaz at the age of 27, lost his life to Fentanyl Poisoning. Brothers Brenden and Alex were 5 years apart and very close. Both college students at the time. Brenden was a political science major at University of North Ga., formerly known as Gainesville State University, and Alex was a month from graduating Georgia Gwinnett College with a degree in accounting, which was received posthumously.

Brenden and Alex were loved immensely by their family, friends and all those that knew them. They both encountered personal challenges which they battled to overcome, and each will be remembered in that spirit.

Scholarship Criteria:

- o Acceptance to any accredited post- secondary institution
- Write a one-page essay explaining how you faced adversity in your life and exhibited strength in the face of personal challenges. Your essay must include how you were able to overcome the hardship and how it changed you; please share your dreams and aspirations as well. Deadline: March 15

• <u>Captain Hugh N. Mulzac Scholarship</u> (open to students of all backgrounds and academic levels district-wide who have a strong commitment to the maritime industry and a desire to serve their country through pursuing a career in the merchant marines)

The Capt. Hugh N. Mulzac Scholarship is merit-based and will provide financial assistance to students who are currently enrolled or planning to enroll in a U.S. Merchant Marine Academy or a U.S. Maritime college. It is open to students of all backgrounds and academic levels who have a strong commitment to the maritime industry and a desire to serve their country through the Merchant Marines. The scholarship amount is \$1,000, and can be used to cover tuition fees, textbooks, and other educational expenses.

Requirements:

- You must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0.
- You must exhibit good character and leadership skills.
- You must be a minority student (including but not limited to African American, Hispanic/Latinx, Native American, or Asian American).
- o You must be currently enrolled or attended Gwinnett County Public Schools.
- You must be currently enrolled or planning to enroll in the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy or a U.S. Maritime college.
- O You must provide a letter of reference from a faculty member.
- You must submit a two-page letter explaining why you are passionate about serving their country through the Merchant Marines and how you plan to use your education to make a positive impact in your community or country.

• Clara Barton Aspiring Nurse Scholarship (Open Districtwide)

This annual one-time award of \$500 - \$1,000 scholarship was established by Shelli-Ann McKenzie. As a Registered Nurse, Dacula resident, community leader, and Founder of Help for Healthcare Professionals (HHCP), a local nonprofit, she felt impressed to support local youth in pursuing a career in nursing.

In an effort to further motivate and incentivize high school students, the Clara Barton Aspiring Nurse Award & Scholarship will be presented annually. HHCP will recognize two outstanding High School

seniors who have been accepted into a 2-year or 4-year nursing program. *One graduating student from each Dacula and Mountain View High Schools will be selected annually. Deadline: March 1

- Describe experiences you have had which influence your decision regarding a future career in Business or Entrepreneurship.

- o Reflecting over your high school years, share an experience in which you exercised significant leadership in your school and describe the result of your efforts.

- o Proof of each varsity letter, signed by the coach.

• <u>Dr. Robert (Bob) Clarke Memorial Scholarship *application forthcoming*</u> (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,000 in honor of Dr. Bob Clarke, a school psychologist at Gwinnett County Public Schools will be presented to a GCPS high school graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in a course of study in school psychology, social work, or a STEM healthcare field. Association.

- o Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0. scale
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member or community leader
- Submit a one-page essay describing interest in a career in school psychology, social work, or a STEM healthcare field.
- Dr. Tarece Johnson-Morgan Scholarship for the Arts *application forthcoming* (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1000 presented to a college bound GCPS senior districtwide. One or more recipients may be named. Emphasis will be placed on participation in the arts (painting, graphic design, illustration, sculpture, literature, film, music, dance, theater, poetry, photography and/or fashion) and volunteer work demonstrating a commitment to making a difference in the community. • GCPS Foundation J. Alvin Wilbanks Educator Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from GCPS with plans to enter the teaching profession.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0. scale
- o Exhibit good character and leadership skills
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a school administrator or counselor
- o Submit a two-page essay describing a desire to enter the teaching profession

Deadline: January 5, 2026

Application

• GCPS Foundation Louise Radloff Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from GCPS who has overcome a significant challenge to become a high school graduate. There is no minimum GPA requirement for this scholarship, and funds can be applied to any form of postsecondary training or study that leads to future employment.

Requirements:

- Applicants should demonstrate good character and involvement in community or school activities
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a school administrator or teacher
- o Submit a two-page essay describing their path to graduation success.

• GCPS Foundation Mathematics Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,500 will be presented to a GCPS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in science, technology, engineering, or math. One or more recipient may be named.

- o Applicant must have a minimum 2.7 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member

o Submit a one-page essay describing interest in a STEM related career.

Deadline: January 5, 2026

Application

• GCPS Foundation Multicultural Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

Established in 2015 and sponsored by the Gwinnett Multicultural Advisory Committee, this Scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000 presented to a college bound GCPS senior of Hispanic, African American, Asian/Pacific Islander or other minority origin. One or more recipient may be named. Emphasis will be placed on leadership roles, community service or volunteer work demonstrating a commitment to the community.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale
- o Submit a two-page essay describing community involvement and the impact from their work
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Have plans to enroll in an accredited college or university for fall 2026.

Deadline: January 5, 2026
Application

• GCPS Foundation STEM Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,500 will be presented to a GCPS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics. One or more recipient may be named.

Requirements:

- O Applicant must have a minimum 2.7 GPA on a 4.0. scale
- O Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Submit a one-page essay describing an interest in a STEM-related career

Deadline: January 5, 2026

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Scholarship and Grant

Begun in 1978, the **Gwinnett Regional Science**, **Engineering and Innovation Fair** is the gateway event for science, technology, engineering, or mathematics projects (STEM) seeking to advance to state/national competition and the goal of competing against the world's best at the **International Science and Engineering Fair**.

The Gwinnett Regional Science, Engineering, and Innovation Fair hosts' students from middle and high schools representing all Gwinnett County Public School (GCPS) clusters, as well as GCPS special entity schools and participating non-GCPS private or public schools that operate in Gwinnett County. Among the special entity schools competing each year is the **Gwinnett School of**

Mathematics, Science and Technology, a school consistently ranked as among the top ten best STEM high schools in the nation by U.S. News and World Report. No application necessary.

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Grant (open to science fair participants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$500 may be presented to a GCPS junior (or team) demonstrating exceptional creativity and problem solving at the regional level. The grant is intended to reimburse for registration, travel, shipping, and/or STEM project creation expenses related to competition at any level. No application necessary.

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Scholarship (open to science fair participants districtwide)

A \$1,000 will be presented in recognition of outstanding performance at the regional level to a one-time to a GCPS senior with plans to enroll full-time at the post-secondary level in a course of study in science, technology, engineering, or math. One or more recipients may be named. No application necessary.

• Georgia Army National Guard GMC State Service Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

There are **85 slots per year for current serving and prior service National Guard/Reserves** soldier. Soldiers admitted through the Soldiers Admissions Program receive a fully funded four-year education valued at \$450,000. These are very competitive and to be eligible the applicant must be a National Guard Soldier in good status. The West Point Admissions Committee determines admission for program.

Requirements:

- o Be a U.S. citizen at the time of enrollment
- o Be at least 17, but not older than 23 years of age on July 1 of the year entering USMA (or not older than 22 on July 1 of the year entering USMAPS)
- o Be medically qualified by the Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board
- o Be a high school graduate or have a GED
- o Be of high moral character and never have been convicted of a felony
- o Submit official scores on the standardized ACT exam or the SAT with writing test
- o Be nominated by Army National Guard unit commander
- Have completed Basic Combat Training prior to admission; completion of Advanced Individual Training (AIT) is not a prerequisite

• Georgia Army National Guard GMC State Service Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

The State of Georgia offers 42 scholarships per year to GMC for awarding to Georgia high school seniors who attend GMC and agree to **serve two years in the Army upon**

graduation. The State Service Scholarship pays for your room, meals, tuition, books, uniforms, fees and is worth \$53,000+

Requirements:

- o Must be a Georgia resident
- o Enlist into the GAARNG
- o Cumulative 2.5 GPA
- o Combined SAT score of 800
- o Composite ACT score of 177
- o Earned no more than 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours of post-secondary hours with a minimum 2.5 GPA

• Georgia Army National Guard Minuteman Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

The Minuteman Scholarships are two-to-four-year scholarships. Offers either full tuition and mandatory fees or a room and board flat rate of \$12,000 per year, covering up to 4-years (8 semesters) of benefits, as well as a \$1,200 per yearbook stipend. You will also receive monthly National Guard drill pay, GI Bill, training pay, and Army ROTC contract pay. The amount of scholarship awarded each year vary. Deadline: December 1

Requirements:

- o Must be a U.S. Citizen
- o Enlist into the GAARNG
- o Between ages of 17–30
- o High School/College GPA of 2.5
- o Must receive a Nomination Letter
- o Must have taken one of the following to qualify: SAT, ACT, or PSAT

Application

• Georgia Army National Guard Service Cancelable Loan (open to applicants districtwide)

Georgia National Guard (GNG) Service Cancelable Loan Program provides financial assistance to eligible members of the Georgia National Guard to be used towards the cost of tuition for undergraduate and graduate programs at an eligible postsecondary institution. The student must agree to **serve in the Georgia National Guard for a period of two years** to complete service repayment. The purpose of the program is to encourage qualified individuals to join the GNG and retain skilled citizens within the state. A student is eligible to receive the GNG SCL for a maximum of 120 semester or 180 quarter paid hours. Deadline: December 1

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the first day of the term of funding
- o Be an active member in good standing with the Georgia National Guard

O Be enrolled at least half-time in a certificate, diploma, baccalaureate, graduate, or first professional degree program

Application

• Georgia Army National Guard Simultaneous Membership Program (open to applicants districtwide)

The Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP) allows students to serve in the Georgia Army National Guard and participate as a member of their college's ROTC program. The SMP offers on-the-job training, reinforces the role of the Commissioned Officer in the Army, and gives ROTC Cadets the experience of working with soldiers and noncommissioned officers. Non-Scholarship SMP Cadets have the option to compete for Active duty upon graduation. Deadline: December 1

Requirements:

- o Cumulative 2.5 GPA
- Enlist into the GAARNG
- o Receive up to 100% tuition

• Georgia Army National Guard UNG Georgia Military Service Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

The State of Georgia offers 42 scholarships per year to UNG for awarding to Georgia high school seniors who attend the University of North Georgia and agree to commission as officers in the Georgia Army National Guard after graduating with a bachelor's degree. The GMS pays for your room, meals, tuition, books, uniforms, and fees is worth \$106,000+ over four years.

Requirements:

- Must be a Georgia resident
- o Enlist into the GAARNG
- o Cumulative 3.0 GPA
- o Meet all regular freshman admission standards

Application

• Geri Flanary Memorial Scholarship (open to Duluth HS applicants only)

Annually, a one-time award of \$1,000 will be presented to a GCPS Duluth HS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study at an accredited college, university, technical, or trade school. Geri Flanary was the heart and soul of the school and was dedicated to caring for students in need. Because she was dedicated to helping those in true financial need succeed educationally, the ideal candidate will demonstrate financial need and will plan on serving the community to help the greater good. Deadline: February 1.

Requirements:

- Applicants must demonstrate financial need through being a free and reduced lunch recipient, 3.0 GPA
- o Submit a letter of recommendation by a faculty member with whom the student works with during their senior year
- Submit a 600-word essay describing a challenge that the student has overcome, the plans the student has for his/her educational future, and how that future will impact the greater good and society.

• GIVE Center West "I DARE YOU" Scholarship *application forthcoming* (open to GIVE West HS seniors only)

The I Dare You Scholarship is a one-time \$500 scholarship that will be awarded to a current GIVE West graduating senior who has positively improved their school-record through empathy, equity, and excellence while enrolled at GIVE Center West. The ideal candidate is one who has become a leader at GIVE West through motivating others. There is no minimum GPA requirement for this scholarship, and funds can be applied to any form of postsecondary training or study that leads to future employment.

This is a non GCPS Foundation managed scholarship. Contact <u>Nancy Nusbaum</u> for details and instructions.

• Gwinnett County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated Scholarship
application forthcoming (open to all Black/African American high school seniors who attend
school in Gwinnett County (excluding high schools in Centerville, Snellville, and Loganville)

Applicants who are the children of members of the Gwinnett County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. are not eligible for this scholarship.

Requirements:

A complete online application that consists of the following:

- o A typed essay on a selected topic (refer to Essay tab)
- o An electronic copy of your high school transcript (refer to Education tab)
- o Three (3) electronically submitted letters of recommendation (refer to Recommendations tab)

Deadline: All items must be submitted electronically by Friday, February 2.
